Our Heavenly Father has called **Carrie Harrison** from labor to reward. She was born on January 27, 1944 in Ridgeway, South Carolina to the union of the late Brownie Harrison, Sr. and Hannah Belton Harrison. Carrie was the fourth of twelve children to this union.

Her formal education began at previous existing: Fairfield County Training School in Winnsboro, South Carolina. She graduated in the Class of 1962. Following graduation, Carrie's work career began in Newark, New Jersey as a secretary with Bencone Uniform Company. She later returned home and accepted work as a Machine Operator with Charm Corporation for 15 years; and then she worked another 10 years at Cinderrilla Knitting Mill, located in Great Falls, South Carolina before retiring in 1994.
