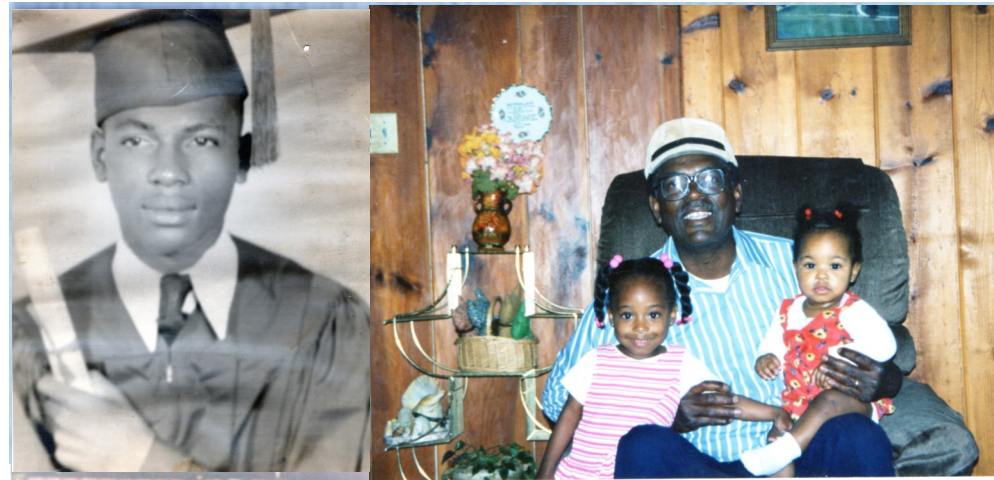
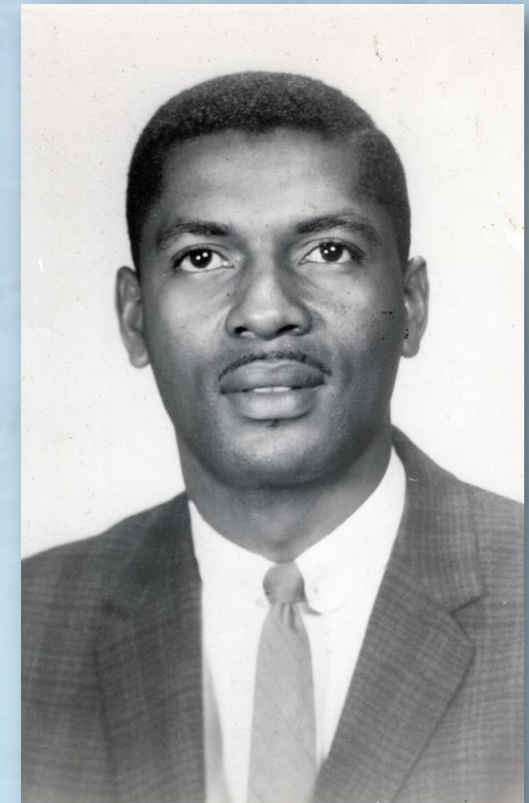

OBITUARY – JOHN H. LEE, JR.

A true giant among men, Mr. John H. Lee, Jr. transitioned to his heavenly home on Saturday, July 21, 2018. He was born in Bainbridge, GA on September 7, 1929, to the late Johnnie Lee, Sr. and Minerva Odom Lee. Mr. Lee was married to the late Harriett B. Lee for fifty-nine years and was the doting father of a loving, devoted daughter, Veronica P. Lee.

After honorably serving in the US Air Force in the 28th Air Police Sq., Mr. Lee earned a Bachelor of Science Degree from Savannah State College and a Master’s Degree from the University of Georgia. He taught in the Elbert Co. School System, and his former students will testify that he loved current events and expected them to keep abreast of what was happening in the world around them. He had no tolerance for willful ignorance or blatant foolishness. He was also a proud member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.

Mr. Lee’s hobbies included hunting with his beagles, fishing at Cold Water Creek, and gardening. He also enjoyed sports, especially “FEETBALL” – as he liked to call it.

Until his health began to decline, Mr. Lee was a faithful member of Vance Creek Baptist Church where he served as a Deacon. He loved his church family and was a strong, positive role model. His life exemplified Proverbs 27:17: “Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance of his friend.”

In addition to his parents and wife, Mr. Lee was preceded in death by a sister, Amanda L. Peek.
