Betty Martin, 93, of Warren, MN, formerly of Oslo, MN, passed away on Thursday evening, October 8, 2015 at Villa St. Vincent in Crookston, MN.

Betty was born on November 27, 1921 in Bloomer Township, Marshall County, MN and was the 3rd of 6 children born to Henry and Mabel (Warner) Larson. She was educated in various country schools and Oslo High School, graduating in 1938. Betty attended Teacher's Training School in East Grand Forks, MN and at the age of 17 began teaching school. She taught for 3 years. On August 6, 1942, she married Casper Martin. To this union three daughters were born, Mary, Rebecca and Nancy. In 1945, they purchased the Walberg farm in Oak Park Township. In 1970, Rebecca Ann passed away and her husband and 2 children lived with the Martins for 13 years. Betty and Casper moved into Oslo in 1983. Casper died on April 20, 1998.
