



Salvador S. Gervasi, age 92, resident of Eads and husband of Dorothy Rose Gervasi, passed away peacefully at his home on October 19, 2017.

Mr. Gervasi was born June 26, 1925 in New Orleans, LA, son of the late Sam and Mary Fiduccia Gervasi of Brookhaven, MS and was preceded in death by a grandson.
