
It is in times like these that we find out how much people care.

Roy attended Douglas High, where he loved playing basketball and was considered a fairly good player. There was however something he was considered to be exceptional at doing; for you see Roy loved to sing. SINGING was Roy's "hobby, his past time, it was his calling card." Wherever Roy was there was "bound to be singing" and most times the singing was coming from Roy. That was just Roy!!! Roy, well-liked by family and peers, was known by many nicknames.

Included in this list of affection were such titles as "Spur, Boy-z, Bro. Carter and Black-man". No matter the name of endearment used, each personal description of him always included his love for and his ability to sing. Music was just a part of his mental and emotional DNA. Whenever you saw Roy, you just knew there was a melody in his heart, on his mind and most times coming out of his mouth. "ROY REALLY DID LOVE TO SING".

Roy's life path led him to Miami, Florida where he met "The Love of his life, the apple of his eye", Annie Lightner. As life would have it, their love flourished and "the two became one". With this union Roy was blessed with a bonus daughter, Lynetta Ann, whom he loved dearly. This union was further blessed with the birth of their "baby girl" Cheryl Yvette. Roy's singing became louder and he let it be known he could not be happier than at the birth of his son and name-sake Roy Nathan Carter Jr. Roy was a proud father and loving husband, he worked hard to provide for his family's every need. After thirty years as a well decorated employee, Roy retired from the Dade County Public School's Maintenance Department.
