Dorothy Lee Stevenson (nee Glasgow) was born on August 25, 1933 in Hallandale, Florida to John Glasgow and Dora Mays Glasgow. She grew up in Hallandale where she attended Lanier Elementary and Junior High. She attended Attucks High School for one year, then transferred to and graduated from Dillard High School in Fort Lauderdale, FL, where she played on the girls' basketball team.

In 1951, Dorothy entered into holy matrimony with Alonzora Stevenson. The couple was married for nineteen (19) years. To this union there was one child, Patreece Laverne Stevenson "Penny", who preceded Dorothy in death.

At an early age, Dorothy gave her life over to God, she worshiped at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Hallandale, FL under the ministry of the late Pastor Foster. Later in life, Dorothy attended Community Missionary Baptist Church in Hollywood, FL under the ministry of the late Pastor Jeffrey Mack, Sr. In the early 2000s, she attended, and later joined, the Star of Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church under the Ministry of the late Dr. IW Hepburn, Sr., which is currently under the leadership of Dr. IW.
