## *I'm Free*

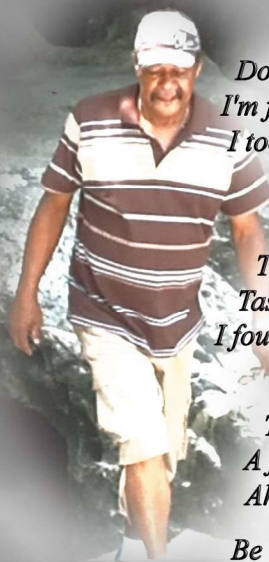
*Don't grieve for me, for now I'm free

# HIS LIFE'S JOURNEY

On October 2, 1949, Reginold Walton was born to the late Royal Marion Walton and Nettie Smith Walton in Roxobel, North Carolina. He was the ninth of thirteen children born to the couple.

Reginold attended W. S. Creecy High School where he excelled as a star athlete in football and was awarded the Hall of Fame Certificate of Honor. Soon after his graduation, he was drafted into the United States Army, where he served in Vietnam from 1969 to 1971. During his tour of duty, he was awarded the National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with two Bronze Stars, and the Vietnam Campaign Medal.

Upon his discharge, Reginold relocated to New York City where he met and married LaVaughn Arline on April 23, 1975. Together, they raised two children, Allene Quimone and John Titus. His love for his children and grandchildren was known by all who knew Reginold. His support of Allene's love of basketball got her a basketball scholarship and him thrown out of many of her games for believing that he was the coach of her team.

When the family moved to Florida, Reginold became a truck driver for Coca Cola and officially retired in 2012. He became a member of New Birth Baptist Church, sang in the choir and drove the church bus when called upon.

Reginold was called home to his final rest on Saturday, March 21, 2020. He is survived by his *wife* of 44 years, LaVaughn; his *daughter*, Allene Quimone (Rufus Shepard III); and his *son*, John Titus. Joining them in mourning are his *brothers*, Joseph Walton and Rick Walton; his *sisters*, Elizabeth Allen, Florenza Walton and Renee Armond; *nephew*, Darnell Hardy; *grandchildren*, Rufus Alphonso Shepard IV, Bryce Reginold Shepard and Raven Olivia Shepard; his *mother in law*, Louise Banks; *sisters in law*, Sherial Knights, Brenda Cobb and Quisha Banks; *brother in law*; Darren Banks; and a host of family members, devoted friends and loved ones.
