RISCILLA SAUNDERS PRATT NIELLY was born February 13, 1925, in Hallandale Beach, Florida, to the late Bahamian Pioneers, Ansel D. Saunders, Sr., of Long Island, Bahamas, and Isadora Aline Peat of Nassau, Bahamas. At the time of her passing, she was the oldest Black Caribbean American who was born, raised and resided in the City of Hallandale Beach, culminating 96 years.

Priscilla was the sixth child of ten Saunders children, five sons and five daughters. Of her siblings, five brothers (Earl Patrick, Pete William, Ansel Daniel, Jr., George Morris and John Timothy) and three sisters (Emmie Aline, Naomi Chairpatra and Elsada Delores) preceded her in death. She is survived by her youngest sister, Catherine Saunders Daniel, who now stands in her shoes as the Matriarch of the Saunders Family.

Priscilla's father was one of the founders of St. Anne's Episcopal Anglican Church. She was baptized, confirmed and received early Christian education and loved of the Lord at St. Anne's. In her adult life she became a vibrant dedicated member of St. Anne's Episcopal Church Women, and Daughters of the King (Ruth, Naomi Chapter), and the Altar Guild: in which she served President and President Emeritus.

God blessed Priscilla with an incredibly long, exciting life, bending time and events in her favor. Thus, she accomplished more than expected or imagined during her life span. She was a well-educated woman, who loved learning. Priscilla attended Lanier Elementary & Junior High School, Hallandale Beach, Florida, and she completed high school as a stellar student in the class of 1944 at Booker T. Washington High School, Miami, Florida. An avid reader, lover of poems and literature, Priscilla earned a "Degree in Life" in which many came and gleaned from her words of wisdom. Her life's dream was to become a Registered Nurse like her "Aunt Lila" of the Bahamas. To God's glory, that dream was later fulfilled.

Priscilla was united in Holy Matrimony to the late George "James" Pratt. To this union, five children were born; John Godfrey, George Clifton and Sharon Naomi Henderson preceded her in death. Priscilla embraced the Emmanuel and Rebecca Pratt Family as her second family, and she became a devoted "sister" to her in-laws; and readily became a second "Mom" to all her Pratt nieces and nephews.

While raising her children as a single mother, Priscilla inevitably became a role model for them as well as others in her church and community who knew her and knew of her. She gained employment as a hotel maid for several years to supplement her income. She became a skilled licensed beautician, but still always yearned to be a professional nurse.

Years later, Priscilla married Ronald Hoover Nielly. Together, they lovingly and successfully raised Priscilla's five children along with Hoover's two children, Reeta and Ronald Jr.
