

and jeans to modeling her 4-H sewing project in heels. She carried out the important lessons she learned from her parents of social, political and charitable involvement. The number of volunteer


hours that she gave during her life are uncomputable. One of her greatest strengths was never being able to say no to those who needed help. She always made time, and could juggle life's duties miraculously.


