

On July 26, 2022, Mrs. Bobbie Jean Gonder Miller transitioned from this life into the arms of her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and received her crown of righteousness for her faithfulness to the kingdom of God.

On April 1, 1929, Robert and Savannah Lumpkin Gonder welcomed their only child, Bobbie Jean, in Athens, Georgia. Possessing a keen mind and a zeal for learning, she excelled in her studies in the Clarke County Public School System, firstly at the Reece Street School and later at the Athens High and Industrial School, graduating in 1945. Determined to become a nurse, Bobbie Gonder enrolled at Paine College but decidedly changed her major after working in the college library. The son of a local farmer, Albert Miller, was working part-time as a gas station attendant while pursuing his degree at Fort Valley State College. They began a long-distance courtship and married at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Athens, GA, on December 21, 1951, with Dr. Charles Gresham officiating. After honeymooning in Florida, the couple returned to Fort Valley and obtained employment with the local public school system. On April 16, 1954, the couple joyously welcomed their only child, Albert Kenneth Miller, born in Athens, GA.

Mrs. Bobbie Gonder Miller faithfully served her students in the public school system of Peach County for twenty-five years; her kindness, encouragement, and standard of excellence left an indelible mark not only on the lives of those she taught but also upon those she encountered.
