**Ruby Alice Hoefer** entered her eternal rest on Saturday, August 6, 2022, at her residence in Columbia, South Carolina. Born in Upper Richland County, Columbia, South Carolina on June 20, 1937, Ruby was the tenth child born to the late Zellie and Geneva Gantt Hoefer.

Ruby was educated in the public schools of Richland County. Upon graduation, she relocated to Brooklyn, New York. While residing in New York, she worked as a telephone Switch Operator for the City of New York for over 20 years. In 1978, she returned to South Carolina and began working for the City of Columbia Water Department from which she retired.

Ruby accepted Christ as her Savior at the early age of thirteen (13) and joined Zion Chapel Missionary Baptist Church #1 under the leadership of the late Arthur B. Bailey. She was a faithful and active member of the choir for many years.

For those of you who knew Ruby, you knew that she was classy, sassy, proud and a dignified woman. She was especially proud of her heritage and being a "Hoefer". Ruby would often say "I'm a real Hoefer." She was sure of what it was and what it meant to be a part of the Hoefer lineage. She was the last elder of our tribe and she will be deeply missed by all who loved and knew her. Ode to *Ruby Alice Hoefer*, our family's "Matriarch."
