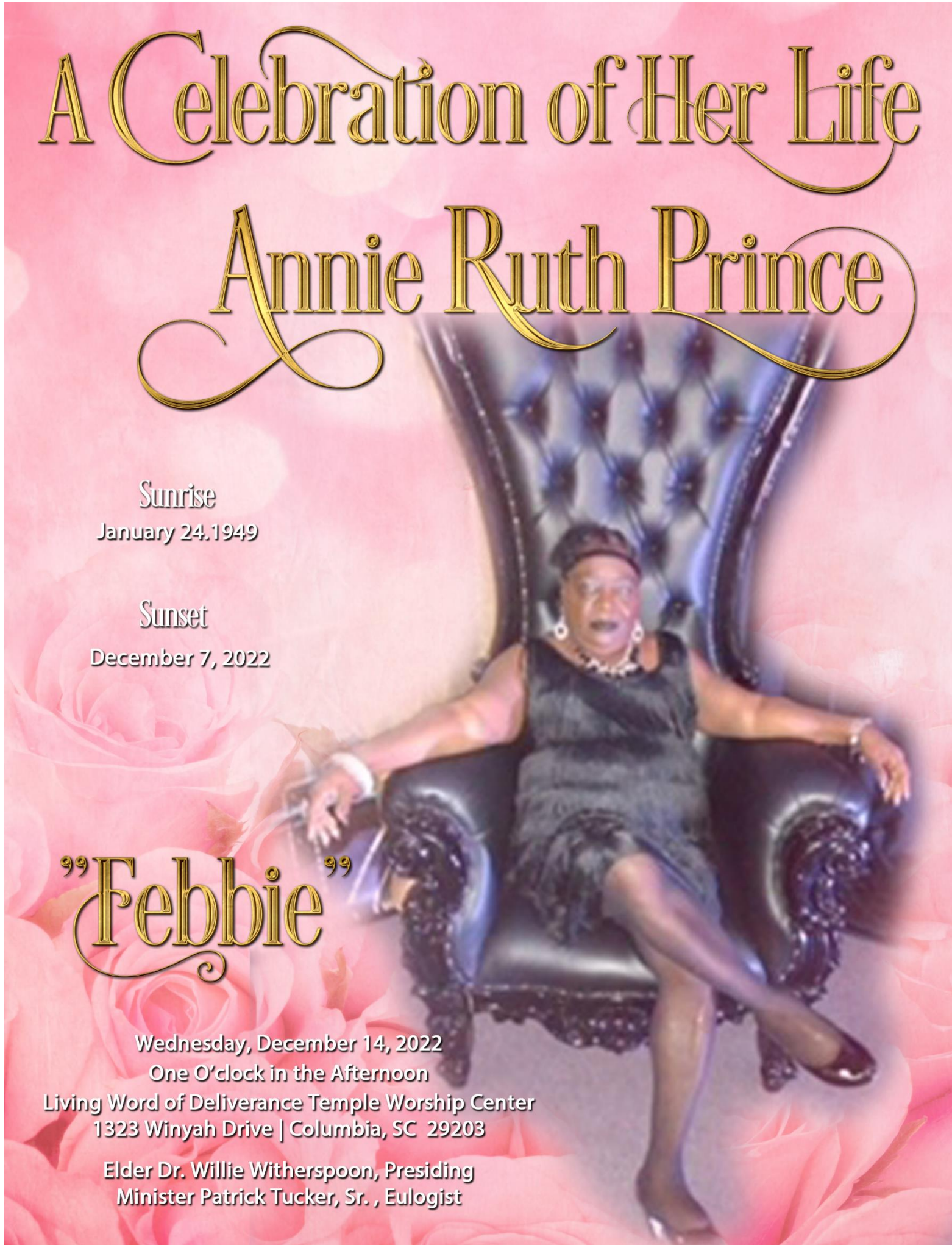

Facing life with all its strife.*

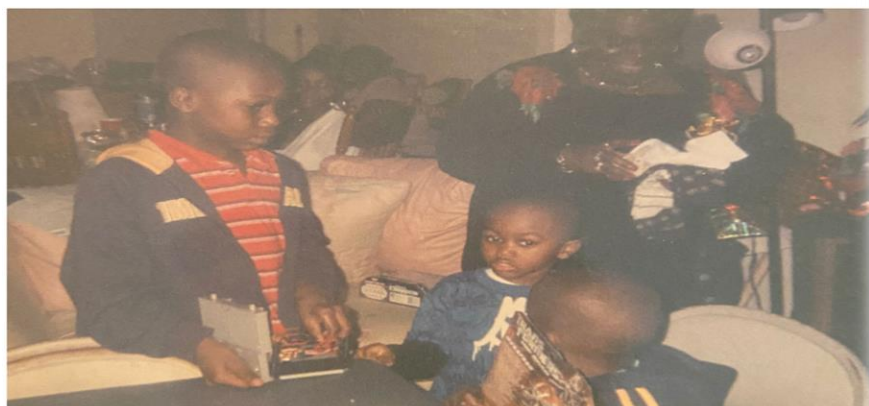
