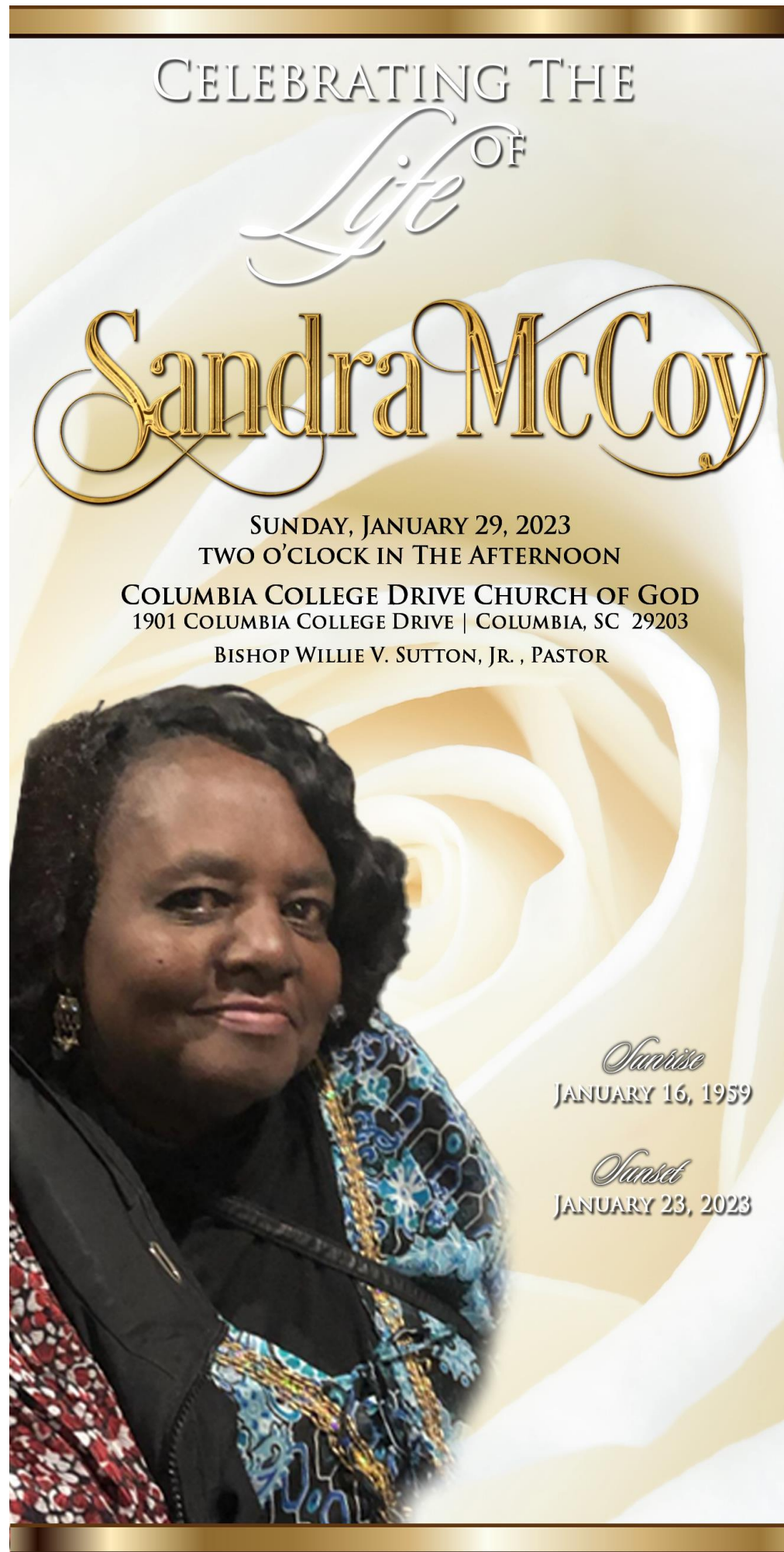

II Timothy 4:6-7*

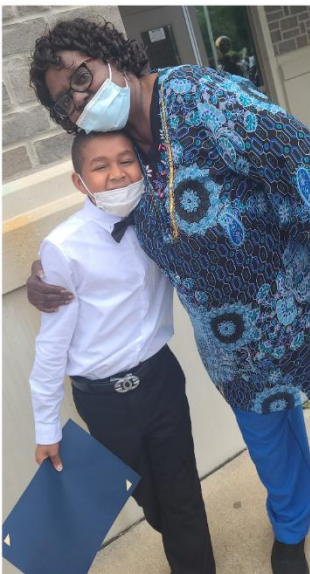
