

Arthur Arnold Yearwood entered eternal rest on January 16, 2017 in Columbia, South Carolina. He was born on June 21, 1933 to the late Lela Blades and Arthur Aubrey Yearwood in La Boca, Canal Zone, Panama. He attended La Boca High school where he met and eventually married the true love of his life, Joycelyn Griffith. Together, they raised eight wonderful children. This was the origin of his favorite saying, "I am the richest man on earth!"

He joined the United States Army for practical reasons and discovered that he loved to travel the world and meet new and interesting people, thus began a distinguished 30-year career. From Germany to Japan and all places in between, Arthur never went to a place he did not enjoy and appreciate the culture, teaching his children to do the same. He was a Vietnam War veteran, honorably serving his country. By the end of his service, Arthur was the recipient of many medals, including Meritorious Service, and had achieved the rank of Sergeant Major. After military retirement, he continued
