

REFLECTIONS OF HER LIFE



Irene Monroe Frierson was born in Bishopville, South Carolina on June 16, 1935. She was the daughter of the late Jackson Monroe and Elizabeth Peterson Monroe. After a period of illness, she was called to eternal rest to be by the side of our

Lord on Thursday, January 19, 2017, at their family home in Columbia, South Carolina.

Irene was a 1951 graduate of Dennis High School in Lee County. Later, she married (now) Deacon Jessie Frierson, Sr. on December 6, 1953, which resulted in a union of almost 65 years. They were blessed with five children: (the late) Carrie T. Sims, Shirley A. Brown (Edward) of Columbia, Jesse Frierson, Jr. (Jerome) of Richmond, Virginia, Curtis E. Frierson (Ann) of Phoenix, Arizona and Lawrence Frierson of Atlanta, Georgia.
