

Pastor Allen Joyner was born on 21 March 1949 in Columbia, South Carolina. He was the beloved son of the late Horace and Marie Joyner. He was called home to be with the Lord on Saturday, 11 August 2018.

“lil man” as he was affectionately called by family and friends, he attended Booker T. Washington High School and later joined the Marine Corps in 1969 to 1971. Pastor Joyner, married his loving and devoted wife Shirley Ann Joyner of 44 years on 8 February 1974.
