Obituary

Deacon Waymon C. Hunter, 90, passed away on June 11, 2022 at Linley Park Rehabilitation Center. He was born to Samuel and Annie Mae Harper Hunter, the 7th child of 10 children, in Anderson, South Carolina.

Waymon C. attended Anderson County Training School, in the Anderson public school system. On February 4, 1953, he enlisted in the United States Army where he was ranked as Specialist Third Class; he was honorably discharged from military service on June 26, 1958. After his military service, he went on to work at Clemson University before going to Gerrish Milliken, where he retired after working 25 years. Not one to stay at home, Waymon C. went on to work at Sears department store for an additional 10 years.

On December 20, 1971, Waymon C. married his wife of 50 years, Mrs. Bonnie Jean Hunter. Together they raised their three children and grandson Sheldon. His wife, Bonnie, referred to him as her "honey."




