Shyheem Requan Khalil Clemons, age 19, of Anderson, South Carolina died Sunday, July 10, 2022 as a result of gun violence. He was born August 23, 2002 in Anderson, SC, the son of Khalilah Gray and Omond Clemons. He attended T. L. Hanna High School and graduated in 2020. At Hanna, Shyheem played various positions

on the football team: safety, running back, and cornerback. He was currently enrolled at Greensboro College, majoring in Engineering with a 4.1 GPA.

Shyheem's goal was to make it to the NFL by eventually attending a D-1 school. He was very ambitious and had a lot of drive. He loved to workout at home and school. He never met a stranger and always lit up the room with his bright smile.

Shyheem will be dearly missed by his parents, Khalilah Gray and Omond Clemons; sisters, Imani, Leilani, Justice, and Journey; brother, Messiah; and a host of loving family and close friends.
