pick the fragrance of life itself.

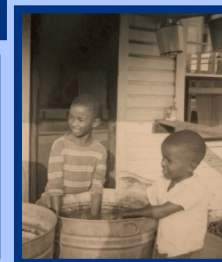
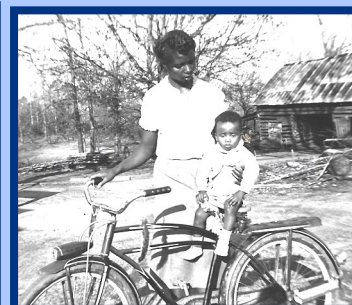
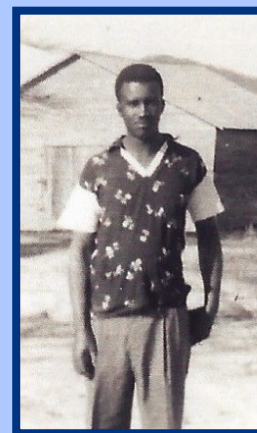
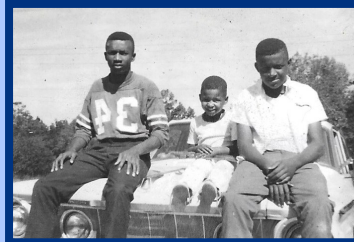
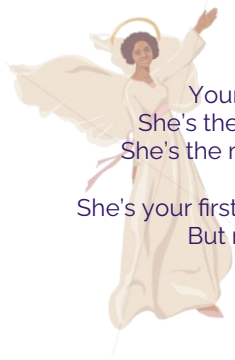
