

I'm Free

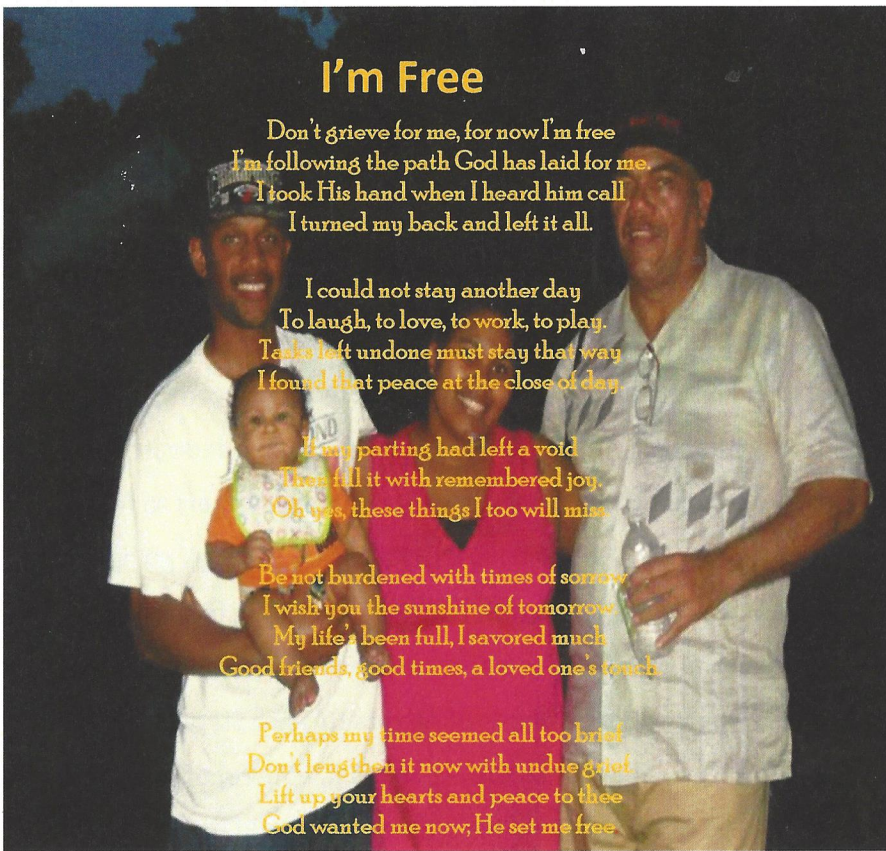
Don't grieve for me, for now I'm free

God wanted me now, He set me free.



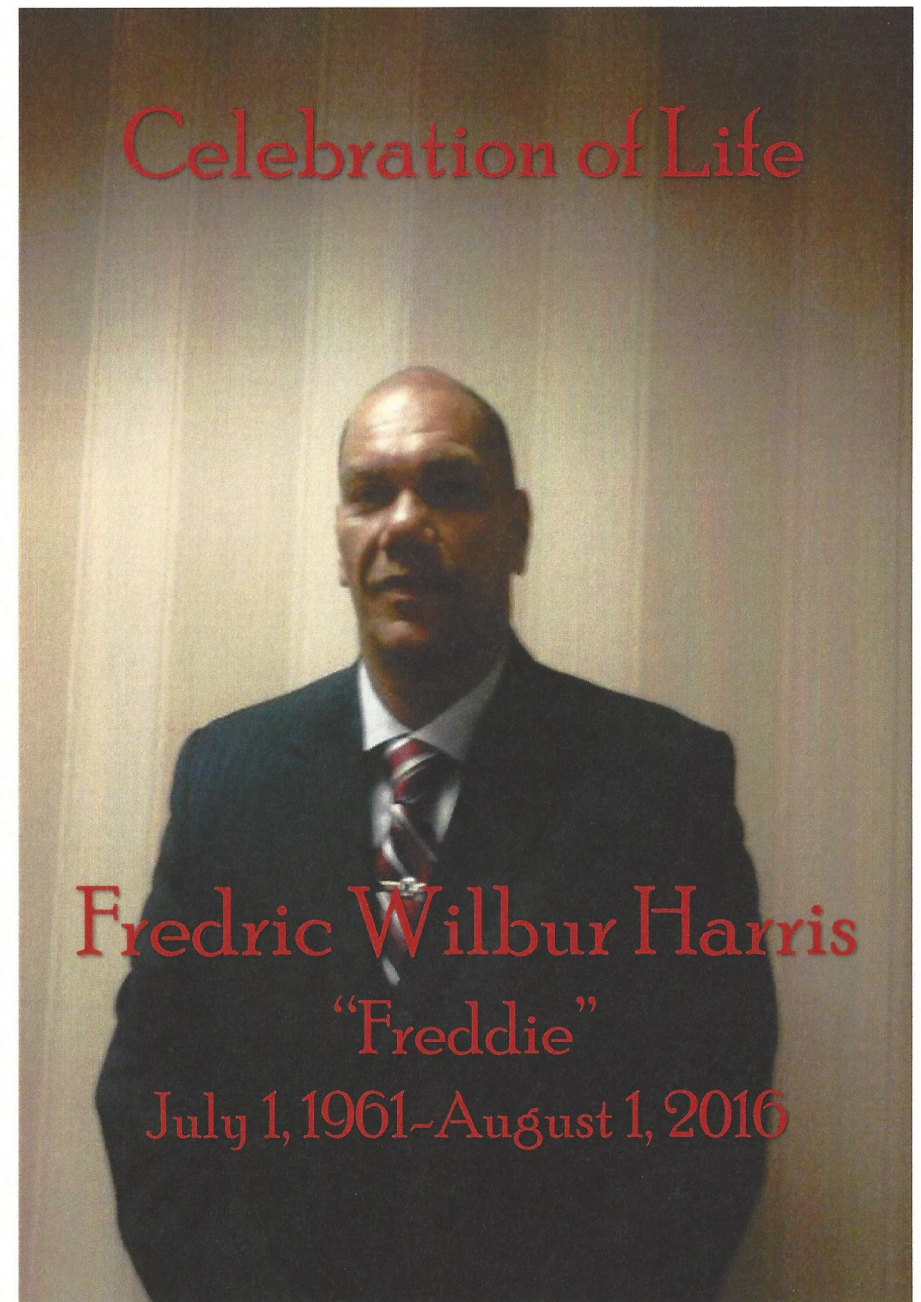
