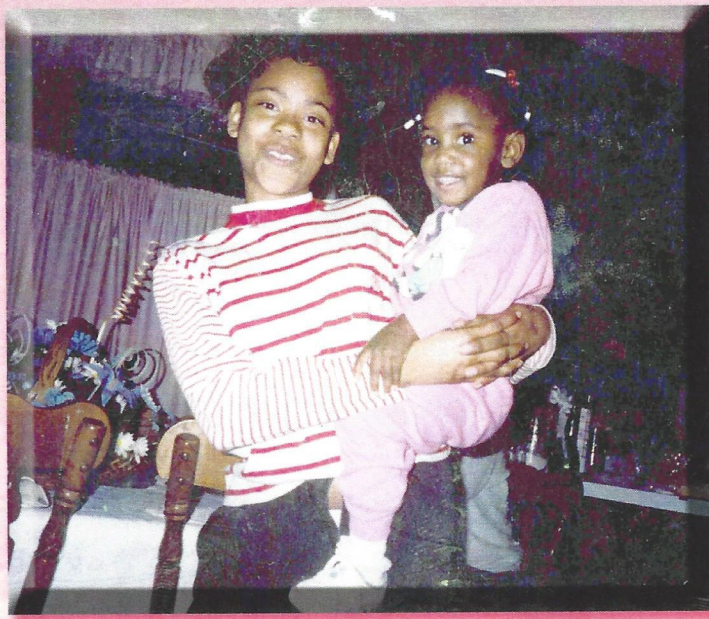
She departed this life on Wednesday, August 10, 2016 at Hospice of the Upstate.

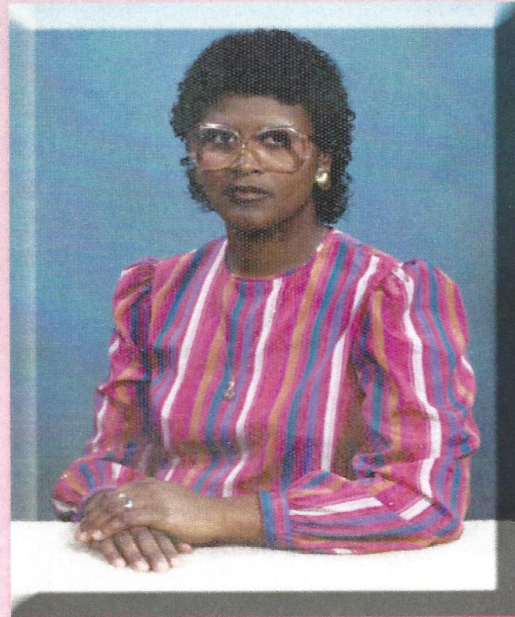
A Time to Reflect

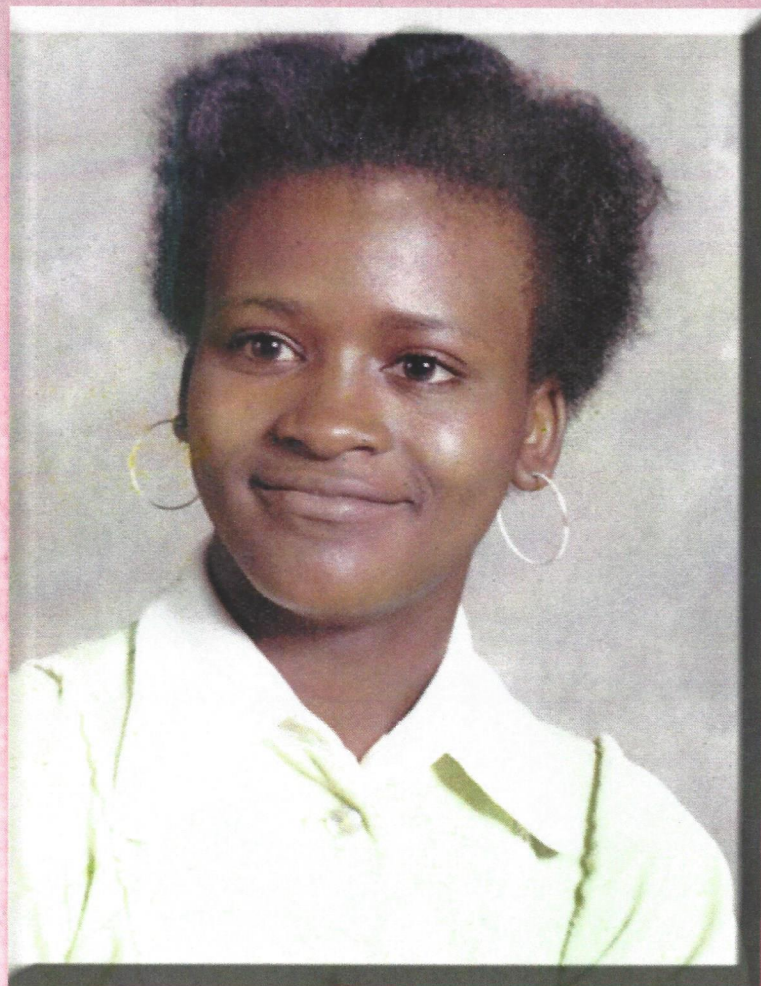
