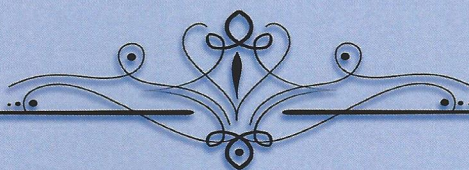

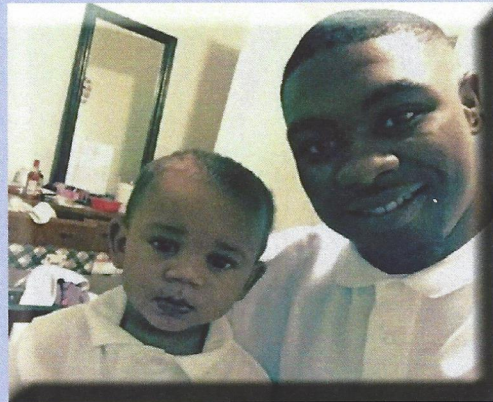

Stairway to Heaven

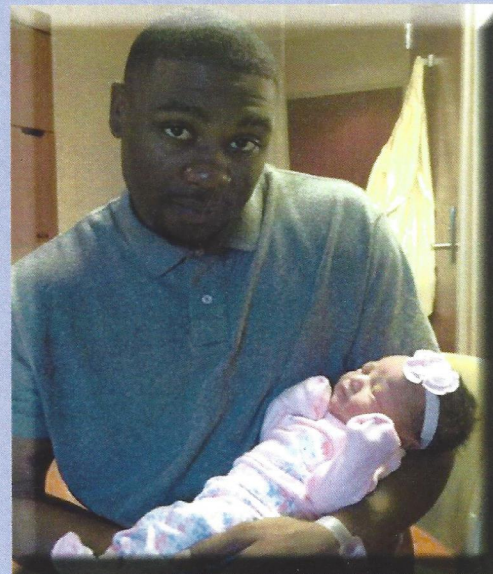
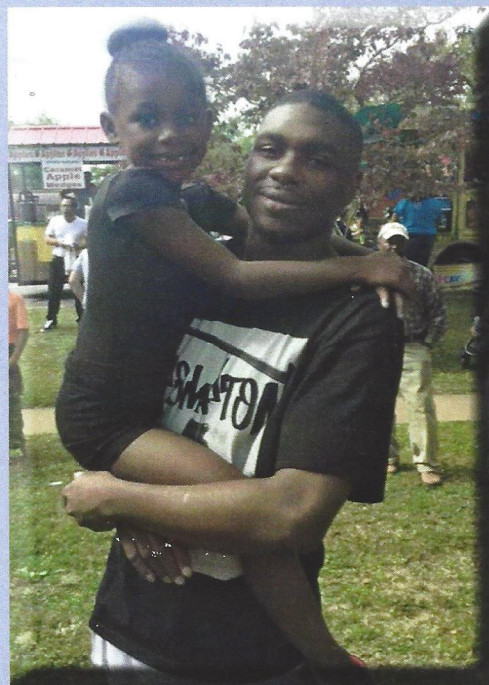
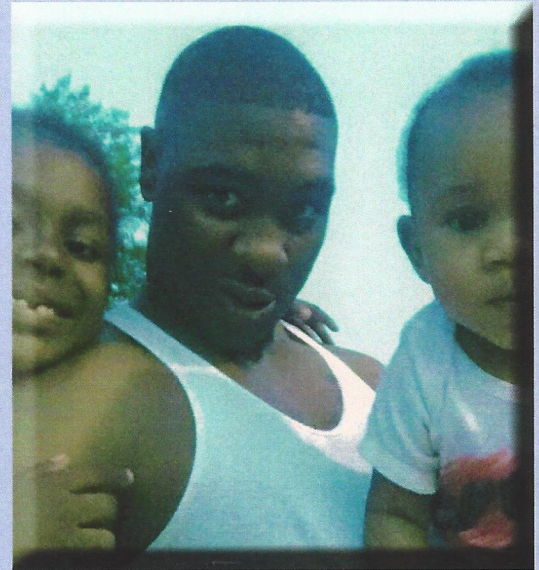
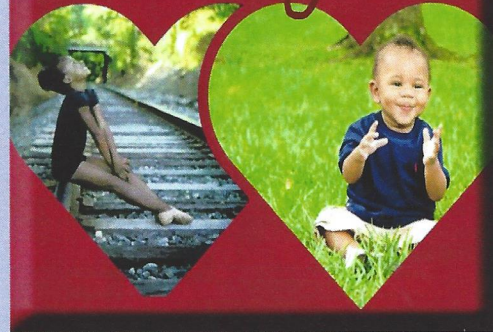
If stairs could build a stairway,

NO ONE will ever know!

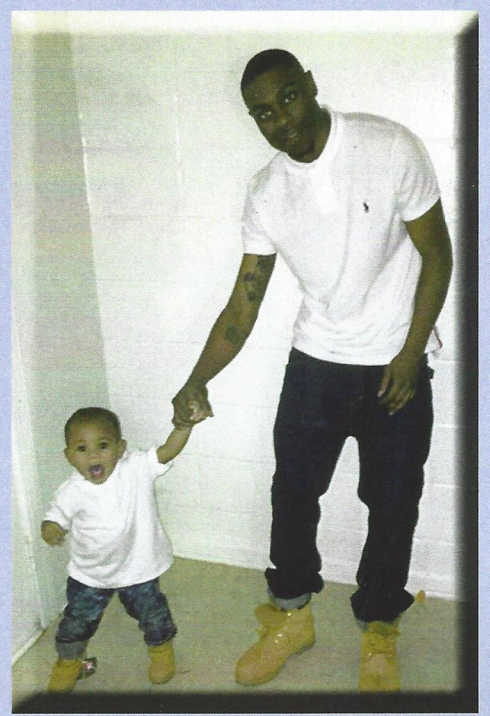
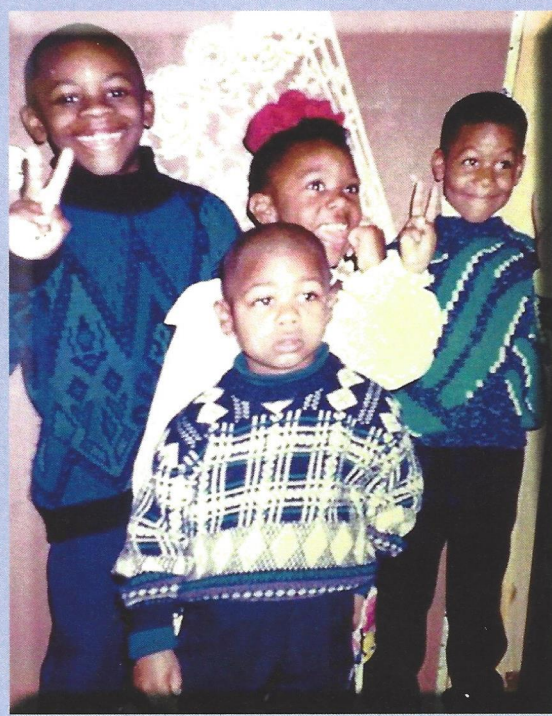
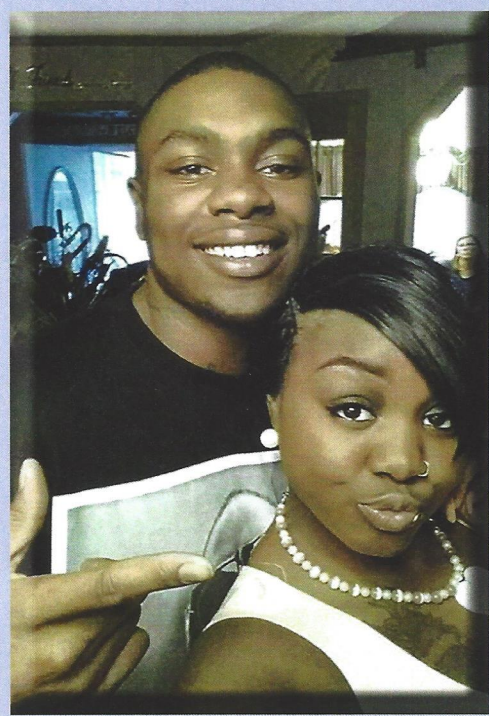

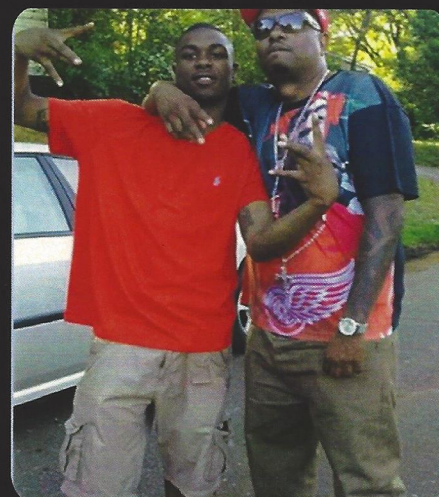
I can't find the words to express the love that I have for you, you always will be my best friend, my heartbeart. I

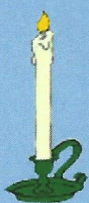
