

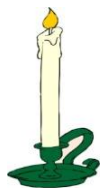

He Was The Best.

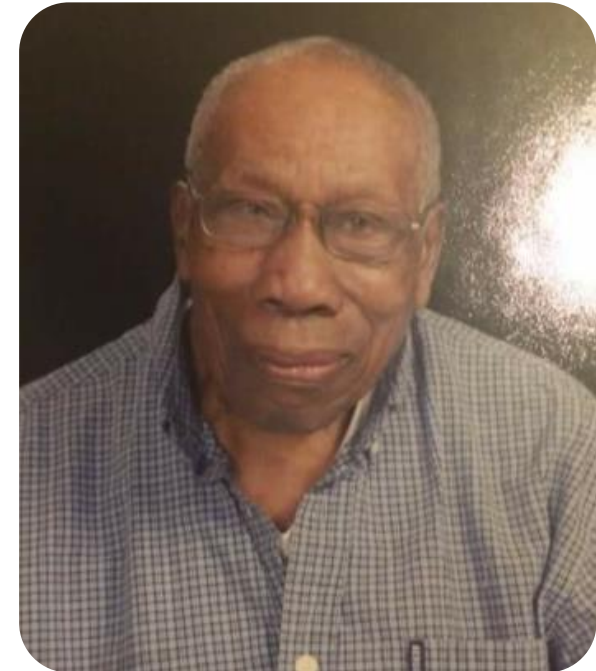
