



MISS ME BUT LET ME GO

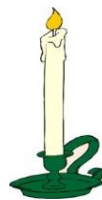
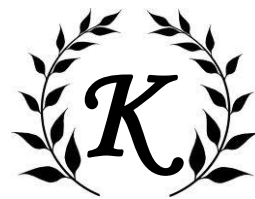
*When I come to the end of the road,
