The Life Journey of Janis Marquita Johnson Lewis Beard

Mrs. Janis Marquita Johnson Lewis Beard, 67, of 1107 Southwood Street, passed away on Sunday, February 3, 2019 at AnMed Health Medical Center. She was born on August 1, 1951. Janis attended Northside Elementary School, Westside High School and graduated from T.L. Hanna Hight School.

Janis was an integral part of integrating Anderson School District Five during summer school at Lakeside Middle School. She went on to graduate from Anderson Junior College in 1971 with an Associate of Arts Degree in Fashion Merchandising. She was a debutant and the first African-American female to work at the First National Bank as a teller; she was the first African-American to work for the Anderson City Police Department as a dispatcher; and she was the first African-American female to work for the United States Postal Service of Anderson.




Janis was preceded in death by her second husband, Joseph Beard and her father, James Willie Johnson.


