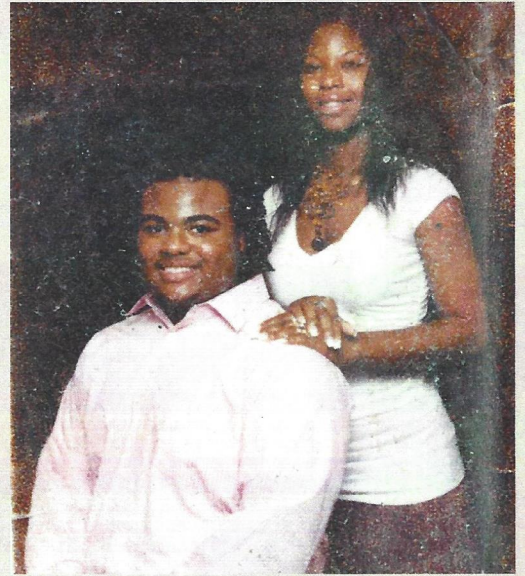
Doug was preceded in death by his parents Nathaniel and Ella Beaty and a sister Dorothy B. Hunter.

Doug also leaves many devoted family members and friends to cherish fond memories.

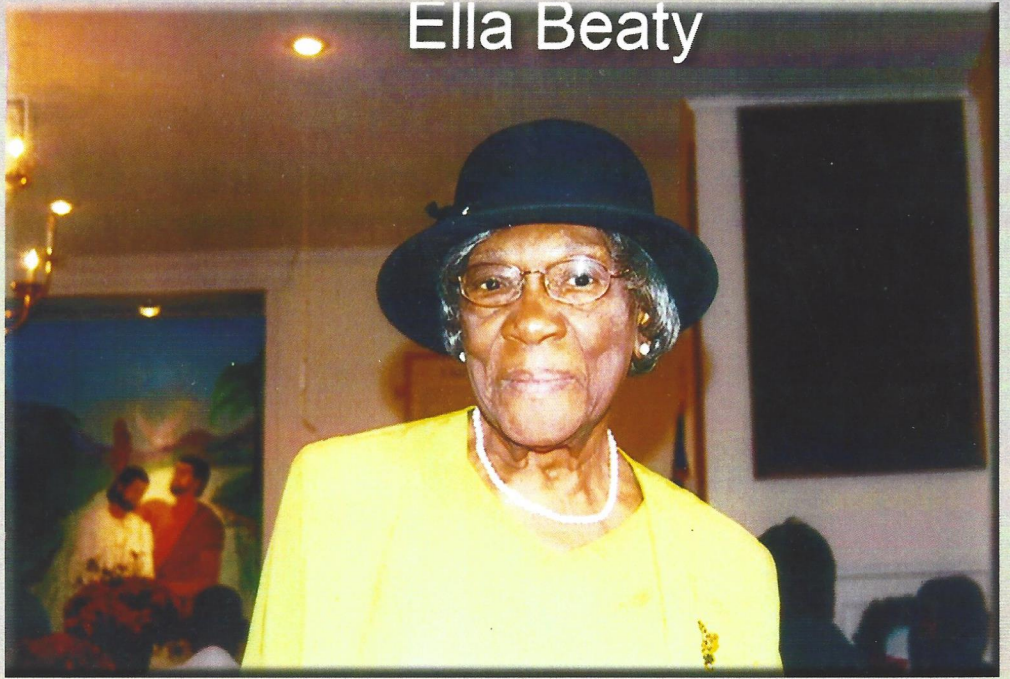
