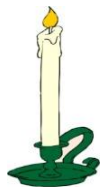

Obituary

Willie Mae Mann was born in Chester, SC on October 24, 1930 to Anna Louise Grant and William Andy McLurkin. Willie Mae fell asleep in death on March 26, 2019 at the age of 88 surrounded by her loved ones.

Willie Mae moved to Greensboro, NC as a young child and later moved to Newark, NJ, attending public schools in both Greensboro and Newark. While in Newark, she met and married Samuel Lee Mann Sr. in 1946 and they had seven children between them. They remained married for 45 years until Samuel's death.

Willie Mae was dedicated and baptized as one of Jehovah's Witnesses in October 1950. In 1957 she became a regular pioneer. She was very instrumental in aiding others to also dedicate their lives to Jehovah God. Willie Mae loved the ministry, which was the central focus in her life.
