

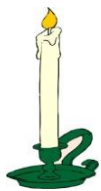
*A Letter from Heaven*

I know you'll miss me too.*

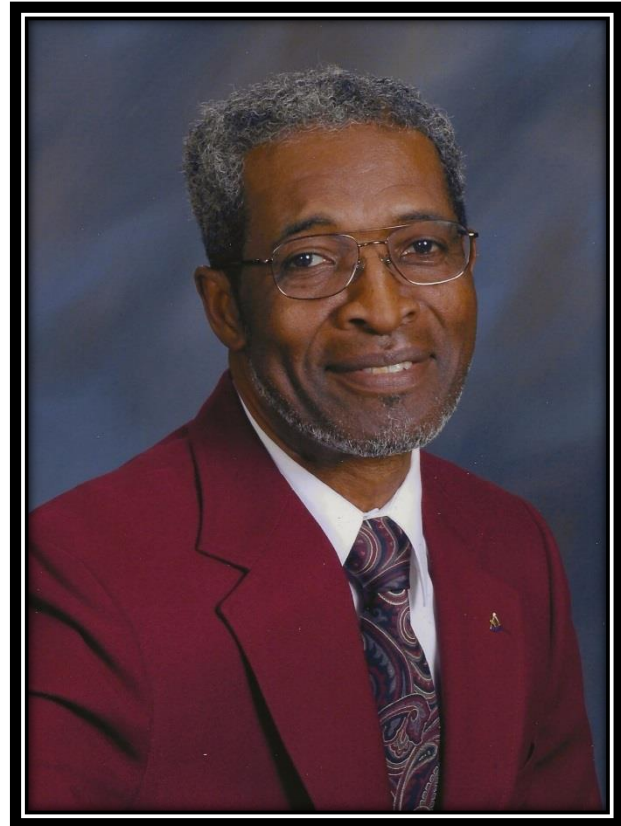

## Obituary

**Mr. James W. Paul, Sr.**, 78, of 3 Admiral Court, former spouse of Dr. Mary C. Paul, died on Thursday, May 9, 2019 at his home. Born in Abbeville, S. C., he was the son of the late Fannie Paul and JD Martin. He was a graduate of Westside High School and Tri County Technical College.
