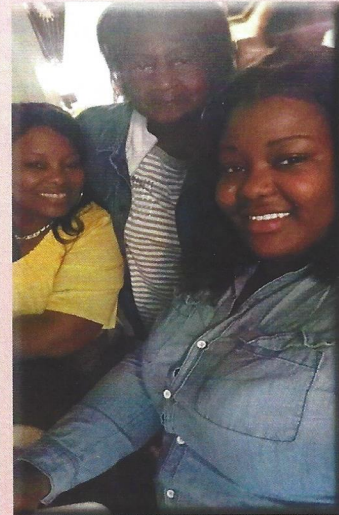






Legacy OF Love

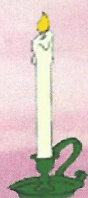
