

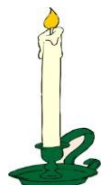
The Fallen Limb

Walter Sloan departed this life on September 4, 2019 at AnMed Health Center in Anderson, SC. He was born September 24, 1949 in Anderson County to Lois Ware Sloan and the late James Sloan. He was the fourth of eleven children.

He attended Geer Gantt High School and later joined the U.S. Army where he served his country for 5 years. He obtained his GED while in service. He served in the Vietnam War and was honorably discharged from the military. His medals include: National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Good Conduct Medal; 10/8 Bar, Parachutist Badge, Vietnam Service Medal with 3 bronze service stars; and Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm. He resided in Washington, DC for a number of years after his discharge from the military. He was a cook by trade. He later return home to Anderson, SC.
