Deacon Jones was the first African American to be served at McDonald's in Belvedere Shopping Center. After being told he could not be served, the owner, Mr. Stewart told the employees that he would be served or they would not have a job, but Mr. Jones would.

Deacon Jones and his two sons, James and Walt, cleaned the Belvedere Shopping Center parking lot every Sunday morning for years, before going to church.

Deacon Jones drove an ice truck and delivered ice to several homes in Anderson County for many years.


Deacon Jones drove for Carolina Produce for years, delivering produce throughout South Carolina, North Carolina, and Georgia.
