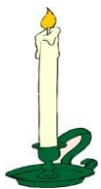


After Glow

When life is done.*



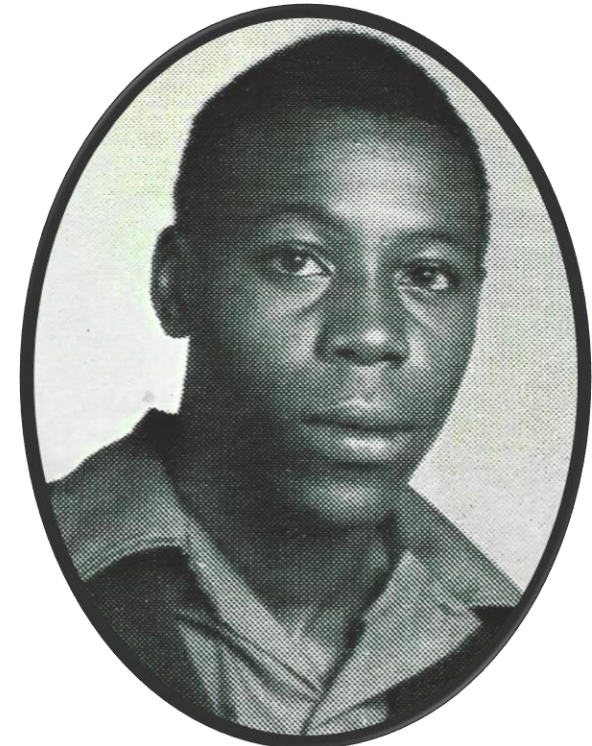
