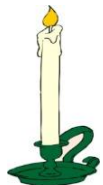


*Miss Me, But Let Me Go*

Miss me-but let me go.*

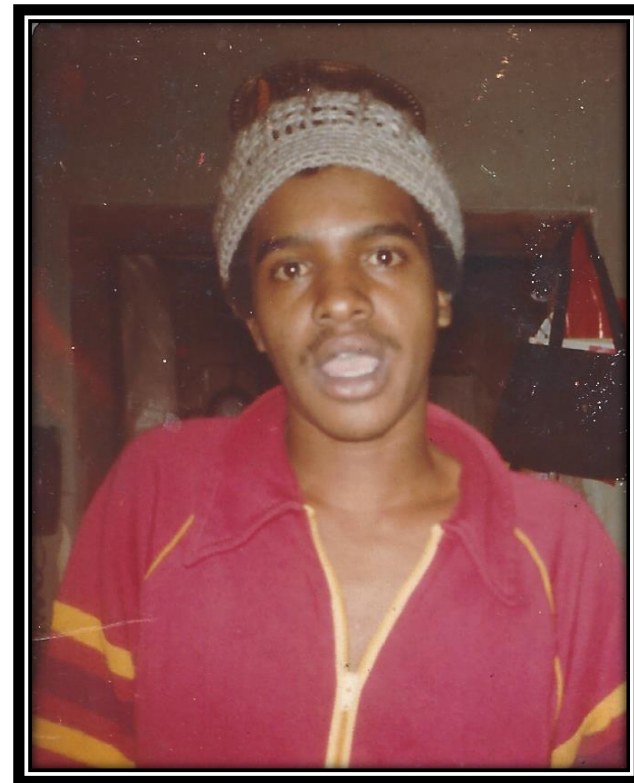
