place a kiss upon her cheek and hold her for a while.

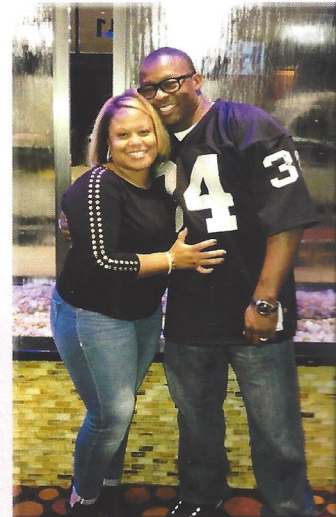
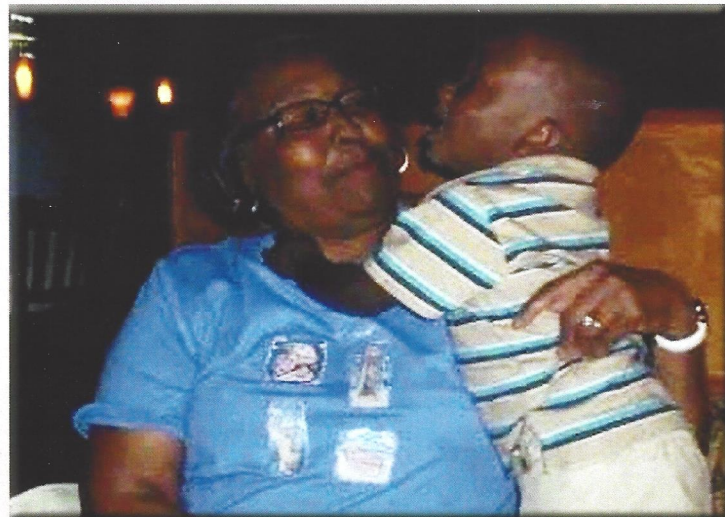

but there's an ache within my heart that will never go away.

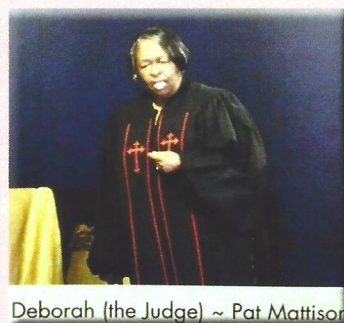
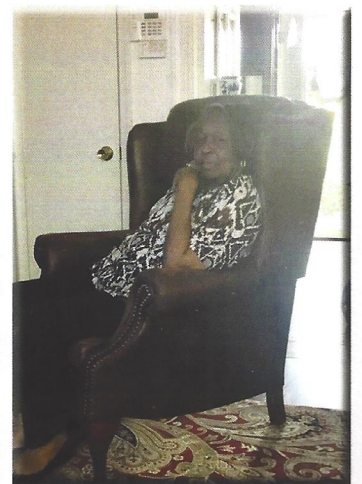

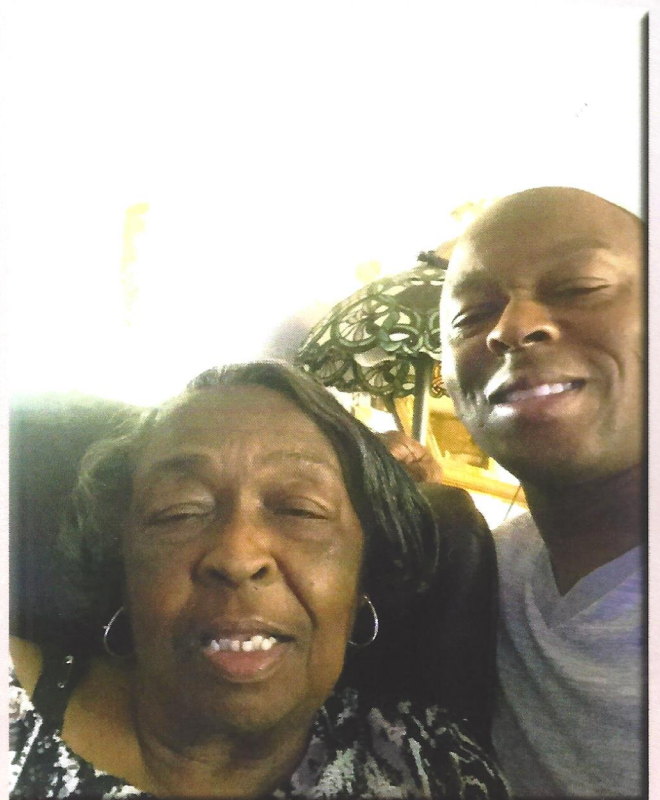
I think about you always
