The Life Journey of Mrs. Saint Clara Smith Williams

Mrs. Saint Clara Smith Williams was born in Anderson, SC on May 16, 1951. She departed this life on Tuesday, December 29, 2020 in Fayetteville, NC.

Saint Williams was a 1970 graduate of Westside High School and a graduate of Fayetteville University. After 22 years of dedicated service in the United States Army, she retired and made Fayetteville her home. As a civilian, Saint started doing contract work in Kuwait for 15 years. She was a member of the Women's Army Corps (WAC). She became a part of WAC when she initially entered the Army.

At her church, Christ Cathedral, she served an elder and a church mother. Among other ministries, she also volunteered with the Nursing Home and Youth ministries. To sum up Saint, whatever the Lord laid on her heart, she could be found doing. She was a willing vessel.
