Tom went on to obtained his Master Gardner certification. Anyone who rode past the Craft's family home knew that Tom had a green thumb. He looked forward with anticipation of attending the annual garden, outdoors and flower expo in Philadelphia, PA.

Although, Tom never obtained a degree in culinary, he was an excellent cook and would prefer to eat at home than going out. He was most comfortable when he was home surrounded by loved ones, whether playing a game of pool, listening to jazz or one of his favorite artist, Frankie Beverly w/Maze.

He also had a flare for fashion, always outfitted in the latest including to complete the look with a hat/jewelry/ cuff links and a swag to his walk. Tom was a great conversationalist – ready to discuss and engaged in a hearty of current events, ideas and philosophy. He was a gentleman, chivalry was not dead, it embodied him.

He was soft, loving, considerate, sensitive and nurturing to those he cared deeply for. He constantly showered his wife with cards and other items of affection and devotion, just because. He attended basic training at Lackland Air Force in San Antonio, TX and was stationed in London, England, Sicily Italy, Andrews Air Force Base, and Bolling Air Force Base, Washington, DC and the Pentagon. Tom served 20 years of military service and retired in 1991. Throughout his military and federal career, Tom received many citations, accolades, awards, promotion, and honorable mentions for his exceptional work performance. After military retirement, he worked for the Veteran Affairs Administration for 25 years, as a Supervisor Program Analyst and retired in 2016. Always striving to improve and better himself, during his employment, he graduated from the University of Maryland with a Bachelor's of Science degree in Criminal Justice.
