#### GOD SMILED ON HIS EDUCATION

**Robert's** early education was in Columbia, South Carolina and then New York. He graduated from Morris High School in the Bronx, New York in June 1961.

#### GOD SMILED ON HIS SERVICE TO AMERICA

**Robert** joined the United States Marine Corps on June 15, 1971, and was stationed in Cuba. Four years later on June 15, 1975, he was honorably discharged as Corporal E-4.
