Pat was a wonderful, involved, and active mother to her only daughter, Kimberly, eventually becoming a doting grandmother with the birth of her only granddaughter, Kendall, in 2008. **Pat** always planned the best children's activities, covering every pool, park, museum, street fair, and children's concert throughout New York City.
