She received her Associate’s degree in Early Childhood Education from The Borough of Manhattan Community College, and was currently pursuing her Bachelor’s degree at Medgar Evers College in Brooklyn.

From a young child, **Shane** was cheerful, fearless, and outspoken. She loved music, dancing and playing handball. **Shane** was well known as an advocate for her family, friends and loved ones. She could be counted on to always “have your back” -- whether it meant speaking up, or throwing hands up!

Shane was a serious lover of life, and was always willing to try new things. Before attending college, she worked at various jobs in the Brooklyn area. She was employed at a local McDonalds, at New York University’s Ruben Hall Cafeteria and was a Children’s Counselor at the YMCA in the Trey Whitfield School of Brooklyn.
