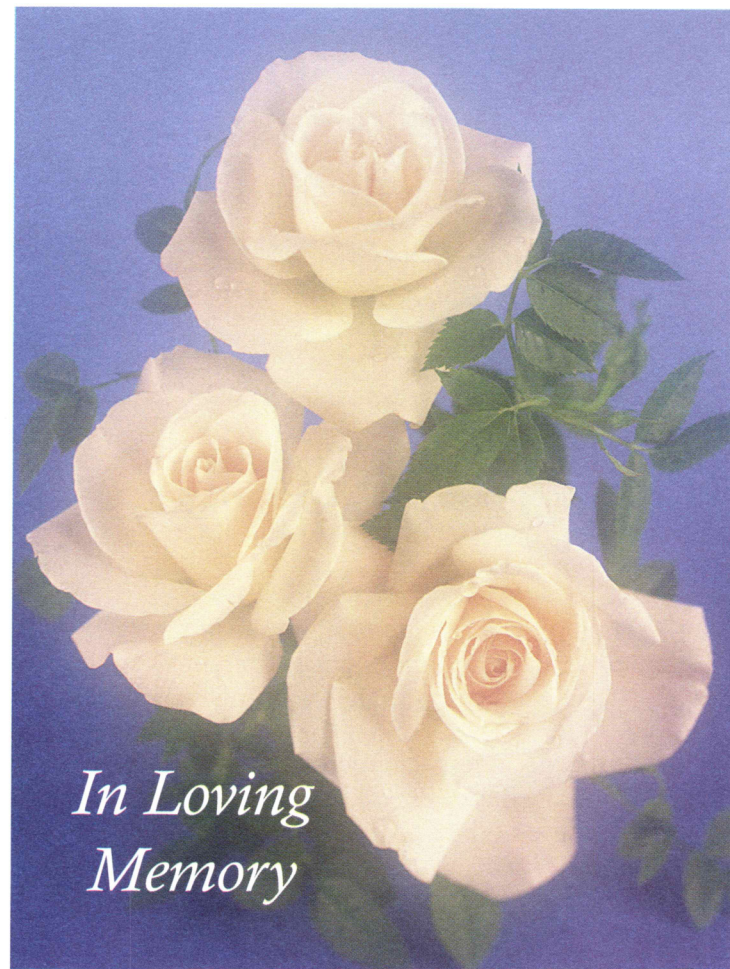
And now she has graduated once again, having the most exciting experience of travel she could ever dream of and joining all the others who have gone before her, to the place of her celebration!
