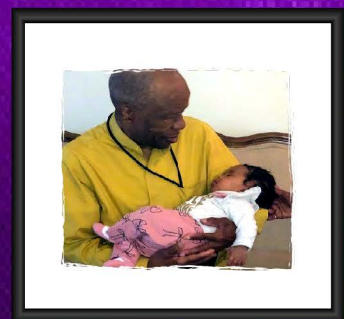
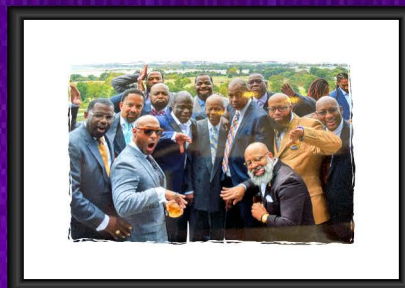

# His Journey

Alphonzo Liggins was born to the late Dorothy Montgomery Liggins and Alphonzo Liggins on August 9, 1931 in Washington, DC.

He was educated in the D.C. Public Schools. He attended Anthony Bowen ES, Randall JHS, and Armstrong Technical HS. While attending Armstrong he was a member of the Cadet Corp, football and track teams. Upon graduating from high school he attended Fayetteville University, graduating in 1956 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in education.

Later receiving a Master of Arts Teaching Degree from Trinity College in Washington, DC. He served in the army from 1952 to 1954. He taught school in Goldsboro, NC. While in Goldsboro he became Head Teacher of East End Elementary School and assistant coach of the Dillard High School football team.

In 1964, he returned to Washington, DC serving as counselor at the Cedar Knoll School in Laurel, MD. Later he joined the DC Public School System working at five schools a week before being assigned to Neval Thomas Elementary School as a full time physical education teacher. His students became the first to receive the "Presidents Council Award on Physical Fitness". Throughout his teaching career he continued his love for sports. He officiated in football, basketball and track. He, also, worked at #9 Boys Club. In 1980, he began Officiating track meets in the District, Maryland and Virginia (DMV) area, as well as New York and Georgia. He officiated at the Special Olympics Games in Atlanta, GA.

"Bud" was baptized at Mt. Moriah at the age of 12. He sang with the Pentecostal/Sanctuary Choir, Condolence Choir and the Young Men's Chorus. He served on the Trustee Ministry for 4 years.

He joined the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Gamma Pi Chapter in 1992 where he serviced as chairman of the Courtesy Committee and became the Man of the Year-1996. He served as a block coordinator for the Fairfield Knoll Civic Association, member of the Pigskin Club of Washington, DC. He lived a full life. Loved trips to jazz concerts, plays, cruises, football & basketball games and track meets.

On December 23, 1967, he married Sylvia T. White. Together they raised their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren.

He leaves to mourn his passing his devoted wife Sylvia of 53 years; three children, Alphonzo R. Liggins, Jr., Terrean S. Waters (Ronald) and William A. Liggins (Jennifer); two granddaughters, Crystal D. Dillahunt (Hezekiah) and Arin Harper Liggins; two great-grandchildren, Kiah and Hezekiah Dillahunt, III, and a devoted sister, Helen Hasty (Joseph). He also leaves three nephews, Adrian Hasty, Sr., Carlton Hasty (Paula), and Minister Bruce Hasty (Andrea).

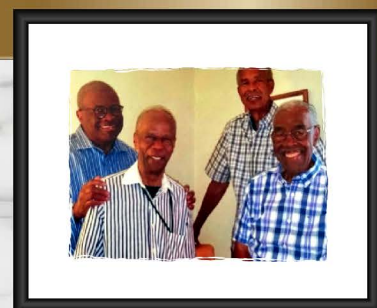
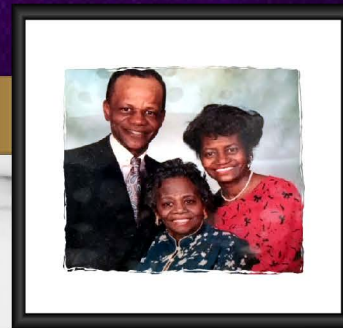
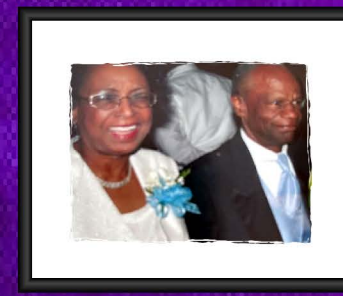
# REMEMBERING "Bud"
