

Alphonzo Liggins was born to the late Dorothy Montgomery Liggins and Alphonzo Liggins on August 9, 1931 in Washington, DC.

He was educated in the D.C. Public Schools. He attended Anthony Bowen ES, Randall JHS, and Armstrong Technical HS. While attending Armstrong he was a member of the Cadet Corp, football and track teams. Upon graduating from high school he attended Fayetteville University, graduating in 1956 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in education.
