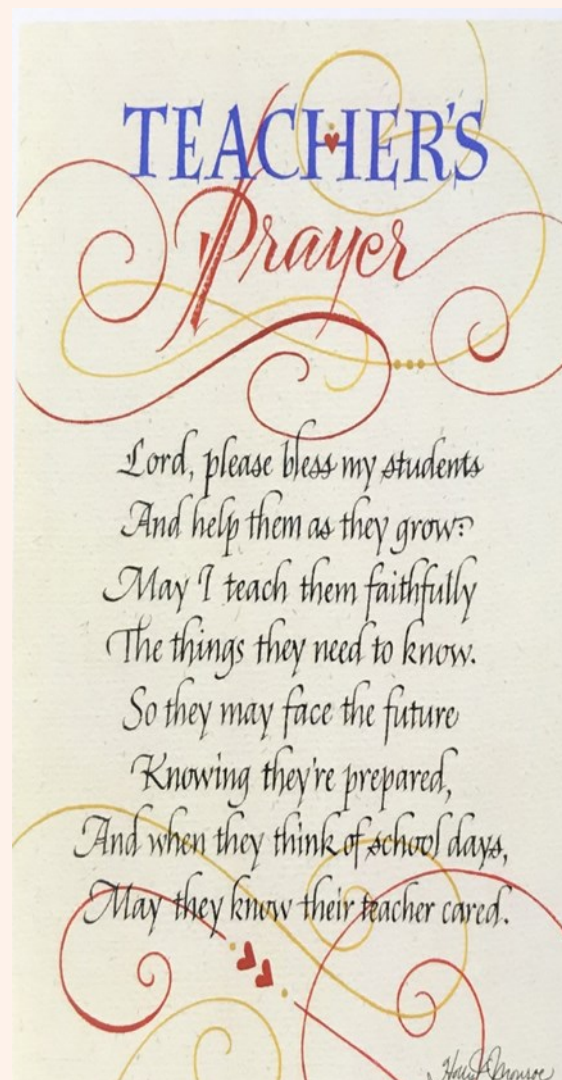

The legend, the icon- Ms. Leila Perry Glover was born in Atlanta Georgia on October 8, 1921 to her parents, Leila Benton and John Perry. She was preceded in death by her mother and father, Leila and John as well as her siblings, John Perry, Louise Perry and Flora Moore.

In her childhood years, she was a product of Atlanta Public Schools. Upon graduating from Booker T. Washington High School, she was awarded an athletic track and field scholarship to Tuskegee University for her outstanding performance in track and field.

After graduating from Tuskegee University, she returned to Atlanta and began her illustrious 45-year career in the Atlanta Public School system at Henry McNeal Turner High School as a Physical Education teacher and girls' coach in the fields of basketball, softball as well as track and field. In 1977, Ms. Glover was inducted into the Tuskegee University Athletic Hall of Fame. She was noted throughout Atlanta for her winning teams. She was also loved and cherished throughout the years by all of her students whom she taught and mentored.

She was a pioneer in the now historic Collier Heights community where she was one of the first home owners in the area. She was an active and supportive member where she received many accolades. It was a delight for the community to see her participating in various community events including decorating her home during the holiday season.

She was a devout catholic and dedicated member of St. Paul of the Cross Catholic Church throughout her life.

On October 8, 2016, Leila's former students ranging the last 50 years celebrated her 95th birthday. During this celebration they honored her with the Leila Perry Glover scholarship for her dedication and hard work to her career. This scholarship is awarded to exceptional female student athletes.

She is loved and cherished by her only surviving great niece, Ansley Green who was the apple of her eye; her dear friends and caretakers over the years, Robert and Frankie Kemp, Sandra Hunter, Gerald Benton, Larry Redding, Juanita and Harold Morton as well as additional family members and friends. She will always be in our hearts.
