Praying I'll make up and this won't be real.

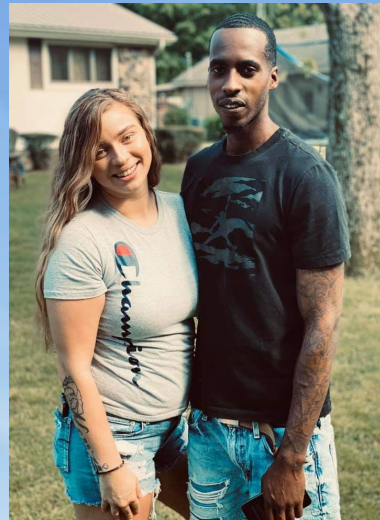
Help me find a peace of mind,
