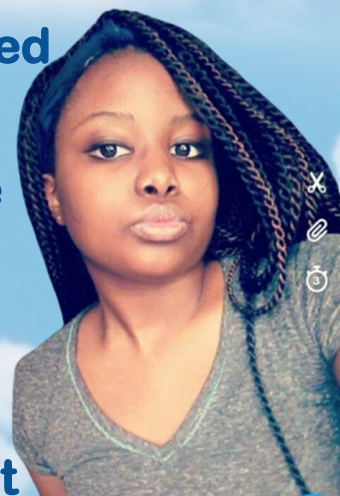
Let Me Go

When you are lonely and sick at heart

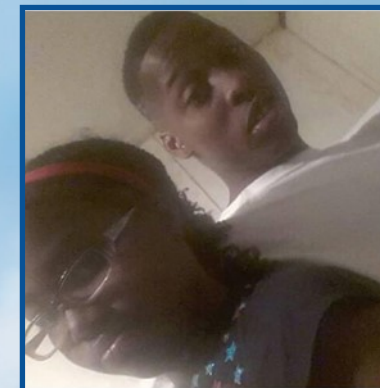
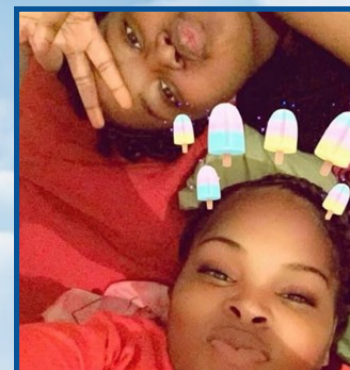
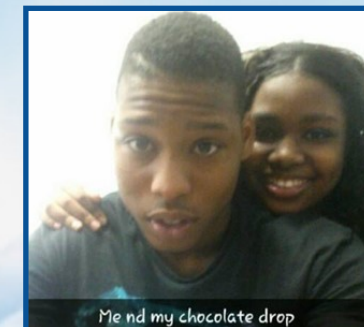
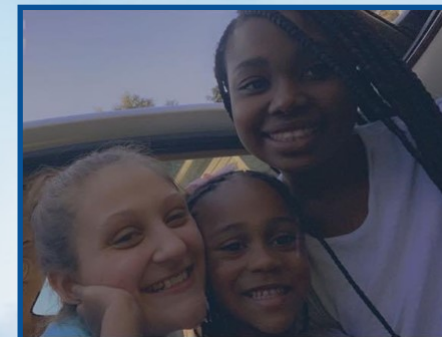

And tell her she is missed every day and night.

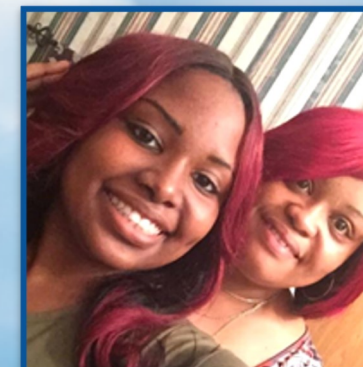


Please tell her she is loved so very dear.
