Tiffany A. LaCroix, 46, passed away unexpectedly after leaving work on Sunday, May 29, 2022.

She grew up and attended schools in Fargo, ND where she graduated in 1994 from Fargo South High School. 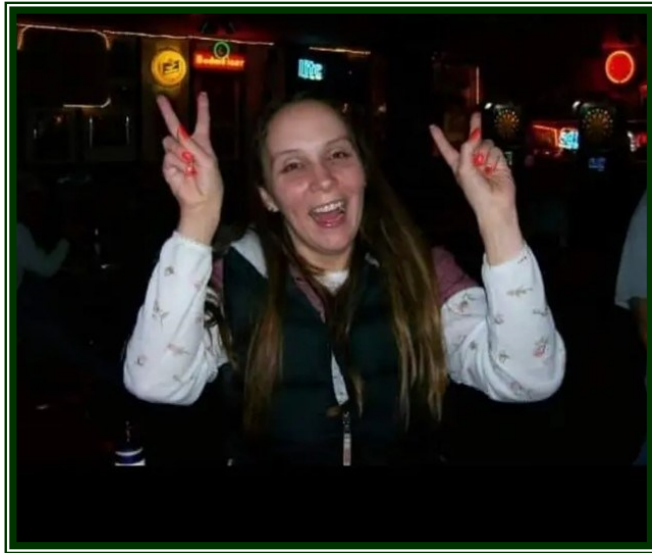
