John J. Spiekermeier, 95, West Fargo, formerly of Casselton, died on Thursday, July 06, 2017 at Sheyenne Crossings, West Fargo.

John Joseph Spiekermeier was born on November 17, 1921 at Fargo, ND to John Henry and Elizabeth (Meierotta) Spiekermeier.
