Remembering the life of....

James D. Stewart died peacefully in Eventide on June 27, 2019, in Fargo, North Dakota at the age of 86. James is survived by his wife, Donna (Schrank) Stewart, his children, Cheri (Kevin) Flanagan, Diane (Elwyn) Krogh, James H. (Jan Ulferts) Stewart, and Debra (Neal) Sundet, all of Fargo; his brother Robert, Grafton, North Dakota; eleven grandchildren; 17 great grandchildren and one great-great grandchild. He is preceded in death by his brothers Jack and Charles and sister Jean Larson.

James Stewart was born on February 20, 1933 in Drayton, North Dakota to Herbert and Segre (Carlson) Stewart. He graduated from Drayton High School in 1951 and earned an Associate of Arts degree from Lake Region Junior College in Devils Lake. He married Donna Marie Schrank, his school sweetheart in September of 1951. His children remember him as a kind and patient father who encouraged them to pursue their goals. James began working in the lumber business in Grafton, North Dakota, Middle River, Minnesota and Hallock, Minnesota.
