After graduating from Harvey High School in 1951, he joined the Army where he served as an explosive ordnance disposal specialist during the Korean war and rose to the rank of Master Sargent. In November 2017, he was proud to join fellow veterans on the Honor Flight of North Dakota and Minnesota to visit Washington DC and the memorials on the National Mall. In February 2019, he was awarded the Ambassador for Peace Medal from the Korean government for his service there.

Other positions he held included, caretaker of the Harvey Golf Course, owner of Rudy's Home Insulating, manager of the Harvey VFW Club, owner of the State Theatre and Drive-In in Harvey and staff supervisor at the Fargo Dome.
