REMEMBERING THE LIFE OF

Eugene Gust "Pooch" Christl was born on August 27, 1933 in Valley City ND to Emil and Hermine (Hanusch) Christl. They first lived on a farm near Lucca ND, then moved to Casselton and later to West Fargo, ND.

In 1953-54 he was in the US Army as a Corporal in communications stationed in Germany. After his discharge in 1955, he went to work for the Union Stockyards in West Fargo, spending a 44-year career as a livestock buyer, capped by opening his own hog buying business.

In 1957 he married Bonnie Highness in Aberdeen SD. They lived in West Fargo their entire married life (62 years). Of this union three children were born, Michael (Sherry) Christl, Brian (Donna) Christl, and Cheryl (Trent) Crowe all of West Fargo. Five grandchildren: Amy (Eldon) Johnson, Stacey (Corey) Herlickson, Cydney (Nick) Barth, Curtis (Lauren) Crowe and Emma Christl. And eight great grandchildren: Jacob Christl, Isaac K. and Clara Johnson, Isaac M. and Abigail Herlickson, Everett and Maisey Barth, and Axel Crowe.

Eugene passed away peacefully October 6th, with family present, after a short hospitalization, from a fast-moving illness.
